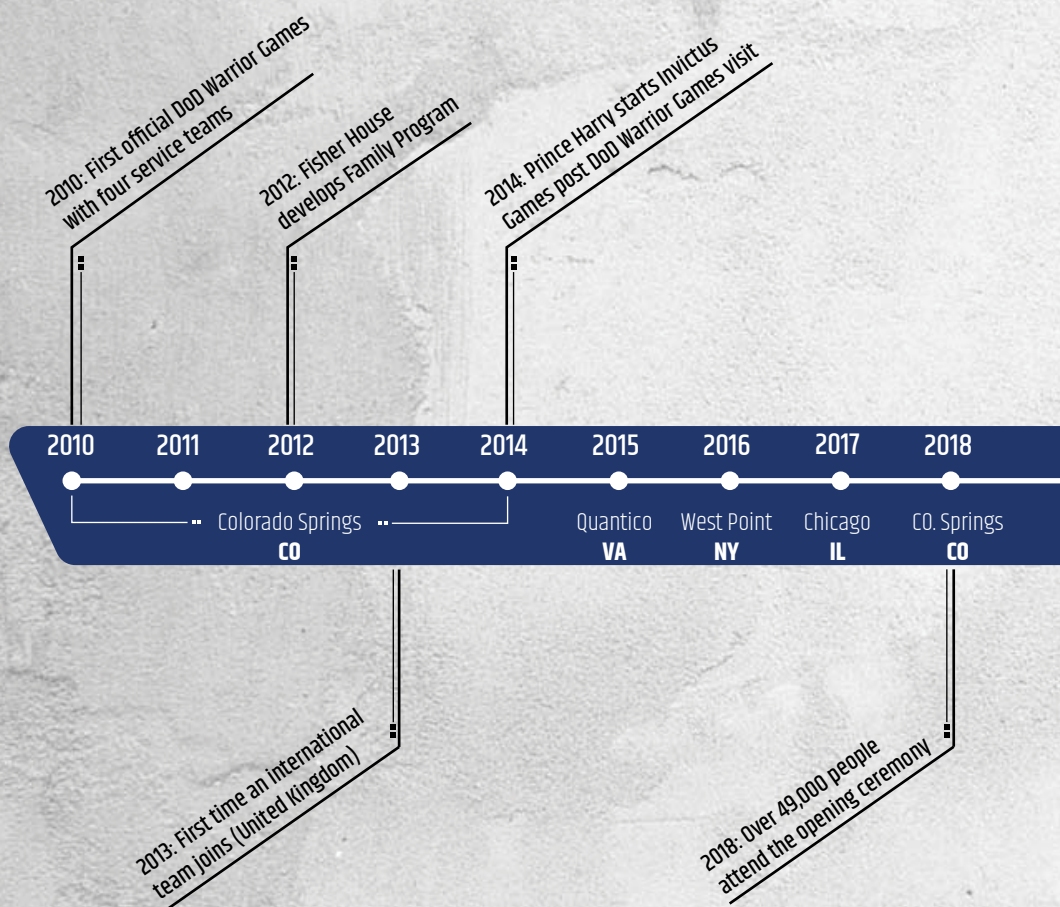


WARRIOR GAMES HISTORY

The Games celebrate all of the U.S. service branches Represented by five teams—Army, Marine Corps, Navy/Coast Guard, Air Force/Space Force, and the Special Operations Command.

The DoD Warrior Games also served as the inspiration for the Invictus Games. In 2013 the United Kingdom was invited to participate, marking the first time an international team competed. That pivotal year, Prince Harry drew inspiration from the event to launch the Invictus Games.

Today, the DoD Warrior Games remains a powerful platform for adaptive sports, launching many athletes toward successful careers, including participation in the Paralympic Games. Originally hosted in Colorado Springs for its first five years, the Games return 15 years later—continuing to inspire, empower, and honor the spirit of our nation’s heroes.
